AA54. Distinguishing between Good and Evil.

We are to distinguish between good and evil.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

But solid food is for the mature, for those whose faculties have been trained by continuous exercise to distinguish good from evil.

Seek good and not evil, so that you will survive. Then Adonai ELOHEI-Tzva'ot will be with you, as you say he is. Hate evil, love good, and uphold justice at the gate. Maybe Adonai ELOHEI-Tzva'ot will take pity on the survivors of Yosef.

Comment

The Greek word in Hebrews 5:14 that is translated "distinguish" in the CJB is $\delta\iota\dot{\alpha}\kappa\rho\iota\sigma\iota\varsigma$ (diakrisis) and is elsewhere translated "discern." Distinguishing between good and evil is a matter of spiritual discernment that requires the Holy Spirit.
