We are to be persistent, steadfast, and alert in our prayers and petitions.

FA1a: We are to be persistent in our prayers and petitions. FA1a: We are to be steadfast in our prayers and petitions. FA1a: We are to be alert in our prayers and petitions.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

Comment

Petitions are prayers in which we ask God for something. There are times when we pray and do not perceive that God is answering. Being persistent means that we should pray repeatedly until God answers or until the reason for our prayer becomes moot. Being steadfast is similar but adds the dimension of waiting on the Lord, maintaining our faith and intention, not swerving in our

dedication, and not losing hope that God will respond. Being alert means praying with *kavanah* (from the heart) and not allowing our times in prayer (especially repeated prayer) to become dull and mechanical. It also means listening for and expecting the Holy Spirit to direct us.
