Comment

Worship is the act of giving ourselves over completely to another; we know from Scripture that the only proper direction for our worship is toward the one true God. This *Mitzvah* #FA8 exhorts us to worship with psalms, songs, and music but, in so doing, does not limit us to those. In fact, the three are meant to be but examples of the many ways we can worship God. Consider, for example, <u>2 Samuel 6:14</u> in which David worshiped the Lord with dance. Other ways we can worship are meditating on Scripture, sharing our faith with unbelievers and discussing God and Yeshua with believers, serving selflessly in Yeshua's name, giving *tzedakah*, elevating God and Yeshua through works of art, contemplating God's creation, praying liturgically, and conversing with God throughout the day.
