# FA14. Not Becoming Angry or Arguing While in Prayer.

# We are not to become angry or argue while in prayer.

FA14a: We are not to become angry while in prayer.

FA14b: We are not to argue while in prayer.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

Therefore, it is my wish that when the men pray, no matter where, they should lift up hands that are holy-they should not become angry or get into arguments.

## **Comment**

1 Timothy 2:8 is the same Scripture that supports Mitzvah FA13: "Praying with Lifted Holy Hands," but appears to support "not becoming angry or arguing while in prayer" as well. It is obvious that such behaviors during prayer distract from a holy and prayerful mindset, but why Sha'ul chose to mention them and not others equally inappropriate is not obvious. Perhaps they were problematic in the congregation being pastored by Timothy; in any case they are expressed as a directive that is as applicable today as it was then, so I have included it in this compilation.
