FA25. Praying for Protection from the Adversary.

We are to pray for protection from the adversary.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

And do not lead us into hard testing ("temptation" in the NKJ), but keep us safe from the Evil One. For kingship, power and glory are yours forever. Amen.

Comment

Among his other instructions on how to pray, Yeshua told his disciples to pray for protection from Satan. Yeshua's prayer in Matthew 6:9-13 is known as "The Lord's Prayer." Most of the prayer is also in Luke 11:1-4, but the Luke version does not include praying for protection. Scripture is replete with references to God protecting us, so why would Yeshua tell his disciples to pray for that which is already promised? It is so that they (and we) will be continuously mindful of Satan's evil plots against us and continually remember from whom our protection comes
