<u>James 4:3</u> entreats us to pray with right motives and exemplifies as a wrong motive "to indulge your own desires." It would nevertheless be incorrect to assume that we should never pray for that which we desire. The NKJ translates it differently; it says: "you ask amiss, that you may spend *it* on your pleasures." Clearly, our pleasures should not dominate our prayers; the ideal is that our pleasures and desires coincide with God's.
