GA1. Repenting of Our Sins & Turning to God.

We are to repent of our sins and turn to God.

GA01a: We are to repent of our sins.

GA01b: We are to turn to God.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

Comment

<u>Luke 17:4</u> commands us: "Also, if seven times in one day he sins against you, and seven times he comes to you and says, 'I repent,' you are to forgive him." However, repenting of our sins is more than saying "I repent." It is being genuinely remorseful of having transgressed God's commandments and must be accompanied by turning to God for the appropriate change in our behavior.
