# HA5. Patiently Awaiting Yeshua's Return.

We are to patiently await Yeshua's return.

This precept is derived from His Word (blessed is He):

# **Key New Testament Scriptures**

#### James 5:7-8

So, brothers, be patient until the Lord returns. See how the farmer waits for the precious "fruit of the earth"- he is patient over it until it receives the fall and spring rains. You too, be patient; keep up your courage; for the Lord's return is near.

Be still before ADONAI; wait patiently till he comes. Don't be upset by those whose way succeeds because of their wicked plans.

Now, ADONAI, what am I waiting for? You are my only hope.

#### Psalms 40:2(1)

I waited patiently for ADONAI, till he turned toward me and heard my cry.

## Psalms 62:6(5)

My soul, wait in silence for God alone, because my hope comes from him.

## Psalms 130:5-6

I wait longingly for ADONAI; I put my hope in his word. Everything in me waits for Adonai more than guards on watch wait for morning, more than guards on watch wait for morning.

# Lamentations 3:25

ADONAI is good to those waiting for him, to those who are seeking him out.

## Micah 7:7

But as for me, I will look to ADONAI, I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me.

# **Comment**

<u>James 5:7-8</u> and this *Mitzvah* are both self-explanatory and clear that we are to patiently wait for Yeshua's return. It is also significant that there are so many references in the *Tanakh* that exhort us to wait for God to act on our behalf and that <u>Galatians 5:22</u> identifies patience as a fruit of the Spirit.
